

## OSAP PERFORMANCE INDICATORS 2007-08 Reporting Year

- Common methodology has been used for the calculations for all program-related information provided by colleges. For example, graduate employment rates for college graduates are based on surveys conducted six months after graduation, whereas university graduate employment rates are based on surveys conducted two years after graduation.
- The data is effective as of November 2007, and will be updated annually.
- The Approved Program Sequence Code (APS) is a number assigned for each approved program by the Ministry of Training, Colleges and Universities.
